1. Welcome Message



SURF (Symposium on Pavement Surface Characteristics) is the only international academic symposium dedicated to presenting and exchanging the latest research findings and technologies related to pavement surface characteristics. Since the first meeting in 1988, the symposium has been hosted by organizations in the host countries with co-organized by PIARC. On behalf of the organizers, we are pleased to announce that the 10th symposium (SURF2026) will be held in Tokyo, Japan. This is the first time of this symposium held in the Asian region, and we are greatly honored to welcome researchers, engineers, and government officials involved in the pavement field from around the world to Japan.

For example, roughness, one of the representative pavement characteristics, affects not only ride comfort but also vehicle fuel consumption and the traveling speed of emergency transportation, resulting in an important indicator from the perspectives of carbon neutrality and life-saving. In this reasons, pavement technology has a broad impact on society, and through this symposium, we hope for active knowledge sharing and exchange of opinions from participants with various backgrounds.

In recent times, new pavement management technologies utilizing Information Communication Technology (ICT), Artificial Intelligence (AI), and sensing technologies are rapidly advancing. Considering the wide-ranging impact of these technologies, it is highly meaningful not only to work individually in each country or region but also to strengthen the sharing of international knowledge and collaboration. Additionally, Japan's pavement technology has uniquely developed under weather conditions characteristic of Asia, such as high temperature and humidity. We believe that the experience and technology of Japan has been sophisticated over many years can also contribute to the development of pavement technology in other Asian countries with similar climate conditions.



In Japan, many historical buildings remain, including shrines and temples in Kyoto, Nara, and the country is blessed with beautiful scenic spots such as Mt. Fuji. 3. Message from Scientific Committee

Road surface is an interface between the pavement and vehicles, and they interact with each other. The road surface characteristics affects things like ride comfort, skid, fuel efficiency and noise, while vehicles, in turn, cause cracks, rutting, roughness, and wear on the pavement. With the period of rapid economic growth over, the ratio of paved road surface has reached about 83%, and almost all national highways are paved today in Japan. For people, pavement is taken for granted and goes unnoticed as long as it functions properly. Roads are visible to people, but pavement has become an "invisible infrastructure" to them.

In our country, the budget and workforce needed for pavement maintenance have become chronically insufficient, and thus pavements are being deteriorated rapidly. To address this, we need people to recognize the importance of pavements again (for visualization) and to acknowledge that investing in them is worthwhile. For that reason, in addition to the traditional scope of pavement research, we believe it's important to approach it from the perspective of 'the interaction between road surface and society.' So, the theme for SURF2026 includes how pavements have influenced our society, daily life, and culture, and conversely, what pavement conditions are needed to address various modern social challenges (like recycling, carbon neutrality, emergency transport, and autonomous driving)—in other words, 'Driving innovation of road surface characteristics and social interaction.'

Papers submitted by May 2026 (those that had passed the abstract review) were peer-reviewed by overseas members of the TC 4.1 and experts from the SURF2026 scientific committee, resulting in about 160 papers being accepted. The accepted papers originate not only much from Japan but also from Asia, Europe, North America, Central and South America, making the proportion of overseas papers high for an international conference held in Japan.

At SURF2026, there will be sessions on eight themes with both oral and poster presentations, where a variety of high-level papers related to road surface characteristics are expected to be presented. We hope that researchers and engineers from both overseas and Japan who specialize in road pavements will gather in Tokyo, leading through their presentations and discussions to a deeper understanding and advancement of technology and knowledge.

This symposium is based on the concept that focusing on pavement surface characteristics and implementing countermeasures can contribute to improve road circumstances.

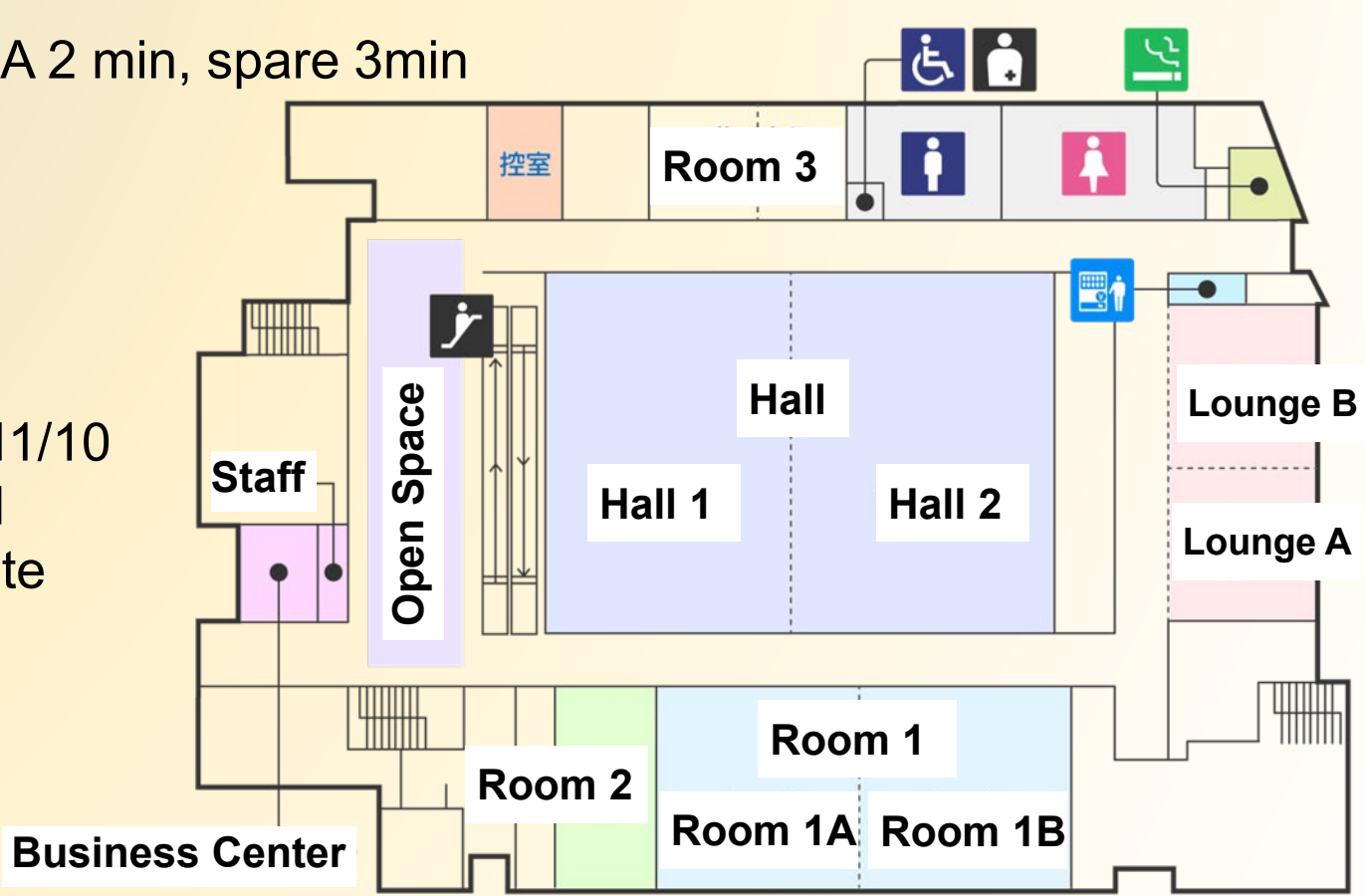

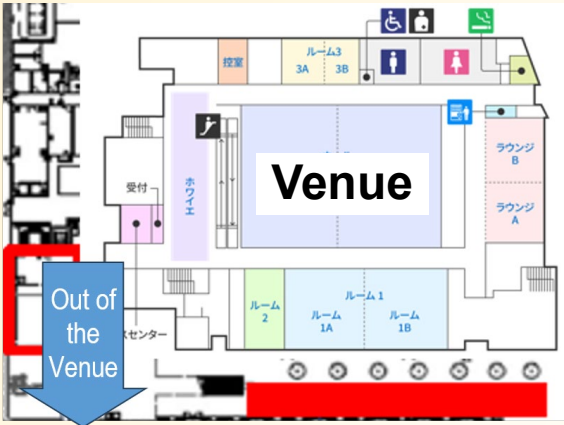

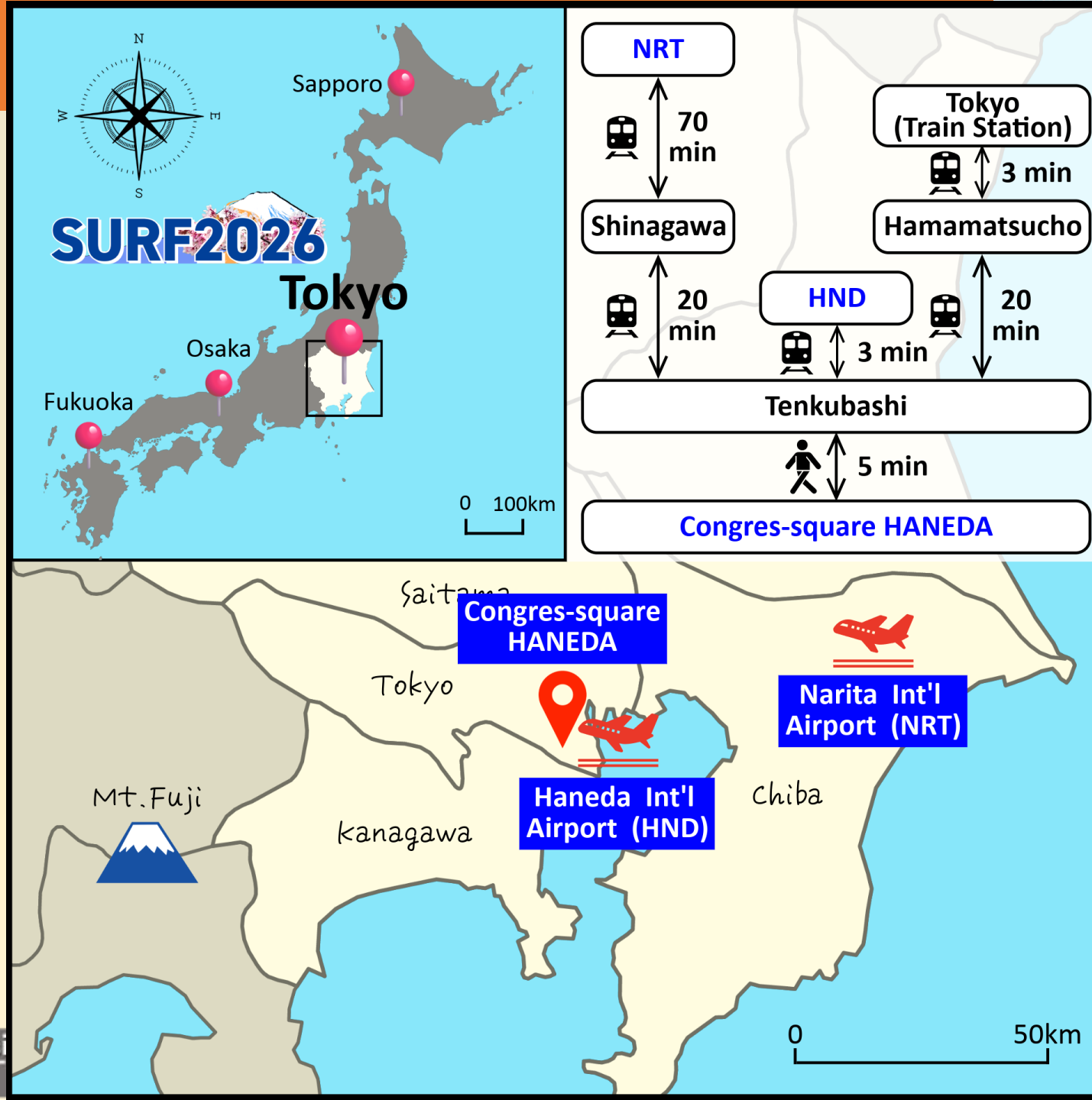
